

## Belgian University Hospital Selects Progress DataDirect OpenAccess to Improve Information Exchange

## 200+ Hospital Applications to be Converted Using DataDirect OpenAccess Software Development Kit

The University Hospital Leuven is supported by a centralized IT infrastructure that serves itself and eight other hospitals; they determined they needed to improve the information exchange between each of the hospitals and began a project to migrate their infrastructure from an existing Sybase database to an IBM DB2 system by the end of the year (2012). The DataDirect OpenAccess SDK was selected because it can convert more than 200 of the University Hospital applications to DB2, while minimizing downtime to less than one hour.
